GLASSICAL

JOHANN SEBASTIAN BACH

Das Wohltemperirte Clavier, Buch I & II – Roger Woodward (Celestial Harmonies)

Since his move to the US a few years ago, Roger Woodward's resurgence of creative productivity has delighted and astonished.

This five-CD set of Bach's
48 preludes and fugues
from the Well-Tempered
Clavier, in two boxed sets
complete with facsimiles of
the original manuscripts, is
recorded with the same
mixture of textural clarity
and rich piano sound as
characterised in
Woodward's recent Debussy
and Chopin recordings. It
captures the spontaneous



quickening of a creative spirit in motion. Yet although his artistic personality is strong, there is no imposed

interpretative manner.
Rather, there is a sense of a player with a lifetime of experience, with the music stepping back deferentially to reveal its intricacies.

Highlights include the five-part C-sharp minor fugue from Book 1 on three subjects and the glorious E major fugue from Book 2. In the truculent fugue in G minor, Book 2, Woodward avoids predictable assertiveness for quiet understatement that builds. You can imagine eavesdropping on a master playing these works to himself in deep contemplation. Peter McCallum
